8.6 Acceptance of Grant Funding from Commonwealth Government Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program - Phase 3

RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1. receive the report by the Manager Economic Development on the Acceptance of Grant Funding from Commonwealth Government Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program Phase 3;
- 2. accept \$3,051,864 in grant funding from the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program Phase 3;
- 3. amend the 2021/22 and 2022/23 Budgets in accordance with the adjustments listed in the financial implications section of this report; and
- 4. authorise the General Manager to finalise and sign the funding agreement with the Commonwealth Government.

Executive summary

Council has been notified in writing of an offer to accept \$3,051,864 in Federal Government funding under the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCI) Phase 3. The LRCI Program aims to assist a community-led recovery from COVID-19 by supporting local jobs, firms, and procurement. It is expected Councils, where possible, will use local businesses and workforces to deliver projects under the LRCI Program to ensure stimulus funding flows into local communities

The purpose of this report is to accept grant funding from Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program of \$3,051,864, amend Council's Budget for 2021/22 and 2021/23, and authorise the General Manager to finalise and sign the funding agreement.

Detailed report

Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCI) is a Federal Government initiative to stimulate funds flowing into the local economy. The offer of \$3,051,864 of funding as part of Phase 3, will assist Council in delivering a range of projects that improve the local community. There is a number of criteria to be met for projects to be eligible under this funding. This criteria includes that projects must be completed by 30 June 2023 which limits the scale of projects that may be included in this program.

Phase 3 of the LRCI Program continues a temporary, targeted stimulus measure responding to the economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. The LRCI Program assists a community-led recovery from COVID-19 by supporting local jobs, firms, and procurement. It is expected that Councils will use local businesses and workforces to deliver projects wherever possible to ensure stimulus funding flows into local communities.

It is recommended, that Council confirm acceptance of the grant funding of \$3,01,864, authorise the General Manager to sign the funding agreement with the Commonwealth Government and allocate the funding to the following identified projects:

- Gulgong Tennis Courts Upgrade
- Kandos Community Hall Painting and Repair Works
- Putta Bucca Training Camp Facility Stage 2 works

Gulgong Tennis Courts

In 2021/22 budget there is an expenditure budget of \$130,000, to be funded \$32,500 by Capital Program Reserve and \$97,500 Grant Funding.

This is to be updated to:

In 2021/22 \$130,000 to be funded by grant funding.

Kandos Hall Painting and Repair Works

In 2021/22 budget there is an expenditure budget of \$80,000, to be funded by Asset Reserve Replacement Fund

This is to be updated to:

In 2021/22 increase expenditure budget by \$80,000 with \$160,000 to be funded by grants.

Putta Bucca Training Camp - Stage 2 Works

In 2022/23 set an expenditure budget of \$2,761,864 to be fully funded by grants

Associated Risks

Operating Performance Ratio

Increased expenditure on new capital infrastructure does not impact operating performance ratios in the current budget year, but will increase depreciation expenditure in future years, which has a negative impact on the Operating Performance Ratio. Any anticipated income will offset this impact, but at this stage, no income budget variations are recommended.

Own Source Revenue

Acceptance of external funding such as grants will cause this ratio to decline.

Building and Infrastructure Renewals

Introducing new budgets to construct new infrastructure such as the Training Camp Facility – Stage 2 will increase asset depreciation in future years causing this ratio to decline.
