NEURORISHOPS OPEN FROM THE MAYOR'S DESK

The region's newest creative space has opened its doors and is available for hire.

Located within Mudgee Arts Precinct, the Cultural Workshops building was a former child care centre and has been reimagined as a multipurpose education, conferencing, and collaborative working space.

The MAP Cultural Workshops are the perfect space for leading creative thinking, education, collaboration and creative development.

This purpose designed facility is fully accessible and offers a series of hireable spaces for the community including a digital classroom/technical suite with recording and editing

facilities, large and small workshops/meeting rooms, co-working spaces, internal and external breakout areas and a kitchenette, all serviced by high-speed WiFi.

The Mudgee Arts Precinct has been funded by the NSW Government, the Australian Government and Mid-Western Regional Council.

NSW GOVERNMENT PROVIDES GRANT FUNDING

\$4.1 MILLION FOR ROADS



Council has secured a further \$4.1

million to continue repairs to the road network.

Repairs will focus on the impacts of the heavy rainfall and flooding incidents that occurred late last year.

Council already has an additional three pieces of plant specifically designed for pothole repair work being used across the region.

Road teams continue to work throughout the region focusing on areas of critical priority. Council thanks the community for its patience as work is completed.

BLUETT AWARD PLAQUE DELIVERED FOR 2022 AWARD

Council won the state's top local government award - the 2022 AR Bluett Award - in October last year, however wasn't able to attend the ceremony due to floods.

To recognise the achievement and present Council with a plaque, the AR Bluett trustees travelled to Mudgee earlier this year.

Council was named the winner in the Regional/ Rural category of the awards. Bluett Trustee Chairman, Les McMahon said Council completed a number of key projects over the past year that improved customer service and diversified the local economy.

"Mid-Western Regional Council's focus on driving improvements across all facets of its

organisation has delivered enormous benefits for its community," Mr McMahon said.

"It completed a range of projects including the Mudgee Arts Precinct and Stage 2 of the Glen Willow Regional Sporting Complex, while also undertaking a range of customer service improvements."

RABBITOHS TAKE DOWN DRAGONS BEFORE 8,317

BRINGING \$1.6 MILLION

A strong crowd turned out for the 40th annual Charity Shield in Mudgee despite very hot conditions peaking at 37 degrees. Some 8,317 people made their way to Glen Willow to see the South Sydney Rabbitohs claim back the Charity Shield defeating the St George Illawarra Dragons 42 – 24. Mayor Des Kennedy commended fans for their patience and behaviour through the day.

"Everything ran smoothly on the day, and it was fantastic to see locals and visitors alike enjoying themselves at a great day out," Cr Kennedy said.

Council estimates from economic data that approximately \$1.6 million was spent in the region over the weekend, at restaurants and cafes, retailers and accommodation providers.

"Large events provide a real boost for our local economy, which is why we continue to work with NRL teams to attract games to Glen Willow. It is equally of benefit to have other events like the Gulgong Show and Country Championships for visitors to attend over the weekend."



LOUISA LAWSON SCULPTURE INSTALLED

A bronze statue of former local resident Louisa Lawson has been unveiled in its permanent location outside of Mudgee Library. A project of the Rotary Club of Mudgee, the sculpture was sponsored through fundraising efforts in addition to a \$40,000 contribution from Council. Council also purchased a maguette of the sculpture as part of the fundraising. The statue was created by local sculptor Margot Stephens and officially unveiled on International Women's Day. NEW EXHIBITION WORKING THE WATERS

Mudgee Arts Precinct's newest exhibition, Working the Waters, is now open to the public. The exhibition of immersive moving image and installation works is the first of its kind shown at the Mudgee Arts Precinct.

It explores humanity's engagement with water across the globe and has been curated by Ann Finegan, arts educator, co-founder and former co-director of the Cementa Contemporary Arts Festival in Kandos.

Ann Finegan has bought together a collection of works spanning over a decade in creation that investigate our complex relationship with water and its cultural, environmental, spiritual and social impacts. This collection of immersive time-based projections and installations showcase grandeur through cinematic scale.

The exhibition is on display now at Mudgee Arts Precinct until 28 May.


