CHARITY SHIELD WEEKEND DELIVERS \$1.49M ECONOMIC BENEFIT

The 2021 Charity Shield has kicked off the Mudgee Region's major events season and is the first to be hosted in 12 months.

A crowd of 6,840 watched the South Sydney Rabbitohs defeat the St George Illawarra Dragons 48-16 at Mudgee's Glen Willow Stadium on Saturday, 27 February.

Council estimates from economic data that approximately \$1.49 million was spent in the region over the weekend, at restaurants and cafes, retailers and accommodation providers.

Council will host the 2022 and 2023 Charity Shield as part of a further two year partnership with the

St George Illawarra Dragons and South Sydney Rabbitohs. The date of the 2022 game will be announced later this year.

HILL END ROAD IMPROVEMENTS Council has recently completed safety improvements to Hill End Road on the approach to Hargraves. Works included improvements to road shoulders, pavement widening, guardrail, and a bitumen seal designed to provide improved contact friction. Council secured \$4.97 million funding through the NSW Government to complete upgrades to 42km of Hill End Road.

Further works are scheduled for 2022.

If you're seeking Council approval on a new build or renovation, you can now submit Development Applications (DAs) online — anywhere, anytime, through the NSW Planning Portal. Use of this service will become mandatory for all councils from 1 July. Through this transition period, to make lodgement as easy as possible, Council will have a dedicated planning kiosk at its Mudgee Customer Service Centre and staff will also be available to assist with the process.



TURF IN AND BUILDINGS UP: GLEN WILLOW STAGE 2

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Glen Willow Stage 2 is on track to be completed later this year with all fields now turfed and establishing.

A total of six playing fields will be constructed as part of the nearly \$18 million project jointly funded by the NSW and Australian Governments.

The multi-purpose, junior rugby league, rugby union and cricket wickets have all been turfed and will need time to establish over the coming months. Construction has commenced on the Rugby Union

amenities building (pictured) with the slab poured and frames erected for the second storey.

Electricity has been upgraded to the site and supplied to the new buildings.


Light tower footings will be installed over the coming months and internal roads are still under construction.

At the nearby new Mudgee Dog Park, fencing has been installed and a pathway constructed from Pitts Lane.



HERITAGE CONSERVATION ZONES:

Did you know there are four Heritage Conservation Areas within the Mid-Western Region in Mudgee, Gulgong, Rylstone and Hargraves. ED STREETLIGHT UPGRADE More than 1600 streetlights in Mudgee and Gulgong will be upgraded this month as part of a major project to improve energy efficiency. The switch to LED will see a 427 MWh reduction in power use and savings of \$141,000 annually. LED upgrades in Rylstone and Kandos continue to be investigated. Residents will receive a notice in the mail advising when the upgrade is headed to their street.

Before purchasing rural land, prospective property owners should consider the following: are there biosecurity risks (weed infestations) on the land, are weed infestations being managed, what are the costs of the continual weed control, and if the land is to be used for farming, will weed infestations lead to production losses? Invest.

Council has secured \$20,000 through the NSW Government's Community Building Partnership Program to refurbish and restore the Rylstone Guide Hall. Works are being finalised to upgrade the hall kitchen, install new lighting, flooring and downpipes. The hall had previously been unable to be used by community groups, however with these improvements is expected to be available for hire from July.

The Mid-Western Region now receives an average of 691,000 visitors a year who stay for 1.04 million nights according to Tourism Research Australia.

Domestic visitors who stay overnight in the region spend on average \$398 per trip. The region's visitors are crucial to supporting the 309 local tourism businesses and 751 jobs.
