GAME GENERATES \$1.67M



A crowd of 8417 filled Glen Willow Stadium for an electric game of rugby league for the seventh Charity Shield held in Mudgee in February.

Footy fans from near and far watched on as the St George Illawarra Dragons reclaimed the shield, defeating the South Sydney Rabbitohs 46-26.

The event was a huge success, injecting \$1.67 million into the local economy and cementing its reputation as the best stadium in the Central West.

Council secured the first game in 2018 through a partnership with the St George Illawarra Dragons and South Sydney Rabbitohs.

The total cumulative impact of the seven Charity Shield games hosted in Mudgee is more than \$10 million. This economic value is based on visitors staying locally, eating out, shopping and enjoying all that the region has to offer.

Council will next host the NRL on 22 August for the NRL Telstra Premiership Round 25 - Penrith Panthers v Canberra Raiders. \$1.67m injected into the local economy

The aim of a Housing Strategy is to guide the ongoing growth and prosperity of our region. This includes the quantity, location, and type of residential development within the Mid-Western Local Government Area.

The Draft Housing Strategy was developed with funding from the NSW Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure. It was on public exhibition from 21 February until 21 March 2025.

During the exhibition period, Council received numerous valuable submissions, which have been carefully reviewed in collaboration with our appointed

consultants. Based on this feedback, the strategy will be refined as needed before being presented to Council for final adoption.

CORICUDGY ROAD \$3.1M

Council has completed significant works along six kilometres of Coricudgy Road near Ganguddy. The project involved widening and strengthening the gravel pavement, followed by sealing it to a width of six metres. It also included reestablishing table drains and clearing shoulders, upgrading the causeway and significant earthworks to lower the crest in the Coricudgy Gap. Works were completed over two financial years using a combination of Council and contract staff. The total project cost was approximately \$3.125 million, made up of \$425,000 from Council funding, \$1.9 million through the NSW Government's Fixing Local Roads program and \$800,000 from the Office of Local Government. A great result for road users travelling to Ganguddy, but also a reduction in the maintenance burden for Council from the regular tourist traffic using the section of road.
