FROM THE MAYOR'S DESK



TRENDS AND CHANGES REVEALED IN NEW LOCAL CENSUS DATA

2021 Census data has been released from the Australian Bureau of Statistics to reveal key changes in the region's population and demographics over the last five years.

Since 2016 the region's population has increased 6.8 per cent (an additional 1,637 people) to 25,713. The number of families in the region has increased 11.9 per cent (723 families) to 6,800.

The number of standalone houses in the region has increased 10 per cent (an additional 806 houses) to 8,811. The region's median weekly household income has increased 31 per cent to \$1,486 whilst

the median monthly mortgage repayment has increased 2.5 per cent to \$1,733. Median weekly rent in the region has increased 22 per cent to \$330.

PREPARE FOR SMOKE TESTING

Council will be undertaking smoke testing in parts of the region next month. Smoke testing of sewerage systems is a technique Council utilises to detect cracks, leaks or faulty connections that allow rainwater to enter the waste water treatment plant. The process involves pumping non-toxic, odourless smoke into the sewer system during dry weather. If Council is testing in your area you will receive a notice in your mailbox.

BUSHFIRE RECOVERY GRANTS

Funding is now available for community projects as part of Round 2 of the Bushfire Community Recovery and Resilience Fund (BCRRF). The grants are provided to not-for-profit organisations or individual applicants to support community recovery following the 2019-20 bushfires. More details and applications via Council's





CONSERVING OUR LOCAL HERITAGE FUNDING AVAILABLE

Applications for Council's Local Heritage Grants are now open.

The grants are available to assist with small maintenance and conservation projects for significant buildings listed in local heritage conservation areas.

Applications can be made for minor repairs and maintenance such as external painting, roofing, restoration of timber windows and awning replacement across heritage sites in the region. Grants between \$1,500 and \$5,000 are available, with

matched funding to be provided by the applicant. Any proposed works are to obtain appropriate approvals, and applicants are required to supply two quotes for the proposed work.

Council currently recognises more than 450 individually listed heritage items and four heritage conservation areas in the Mid-Western Region. Applications close 2 September.

Have you signed up for YourWater? Monitor and track your daily water consumption and detect leaks in real time with Council's Smart Water Meter Portal.

Along with daily data on the amount of water being used in the home, customers can review water charges and set up email and SMS alerts to notify of possible water leaks and high consumption periods.

MUDGEE ARTS PRECINCT LAUNCHES NEW EXHIBITION

Mudgee Arts Precinct's latest exhibition, Mating Dance by Anna-Wili Highfield was unveiled last month, and will be open until 26 September.

The exhibition celebrates Australia's principal dancing bird - the brolga, and features unique sculptures sewn from waxed cotton of the Australian native birds suspended like marionettes. The exhibition is accompanied by an original sound composition by composer Bree Van Reyk, which will intermittently join

the dancing birds with instrumentals inspired by the brolgas bold trumpeting.

Anna-Wili studied fine art at the National Art School, Sydney and worked for many years as a scenic artist for Opera Australia, before establishing herself independently as a practising artist.

NOTIFY PLANNED BURNS

Are you planning a burn-off on your property? You must first do the following to minimise fire risk: Check whether it is a total fire ban/no burn day, notify your neighbours and the Cudgegong District Fire Control Centre at least 24 hours prior and obtain any necessary approvals, have appropriate fire-fighting equipment on hand, and monitor the fire until it is completely extinguished. PRIORITY WEED FIREWEED

There has been an increased appearance of Fireweed (Senecio madagascariensis) throughout the region, particularly on Ulan Road, Mudgee. Fireweed reduces productivity, is poisonous to livestock and can be difficult to control. Each plant can produce up to 18,000 seeds and can spread via wind and animals. UNITAR ROAD COMPLETE

The most recent stage of Wollar Road upgrades, including road sealing and line marking, will be finalised over coming weeks. Temporary speed limits have been removed and traffic can now travel this road with no interruptions. The road has been made significantly safer with the realignment of two dangerous curves as part of the three-year road safety upgrade.

The speed limit on Putta Bucca Road, Mudgee has now changed from 80km/h to 60km/h. The existing 50km/h zone on Putta Bucca Road (via Castlereagh Highway) remains, with the speed limit change in force from the end of this zone through to Henry Lawson Drive. Council has provided more than \$10,000 to support local events in our region, including \$500 to Mudgee Bridge Club for the 2022 Mudgee Bridge Club Congress in November, \$2,500 to the 2022 NSW PSSA Boys Softball Championships in August and \$2,000 for the 2022 Kandos Street Machine. Mudgee Gulgong Wolves FC and Mudgee Race Club each received \$2000 as part of multi-year funding for their events, as well as support for Gulgong Swap Meet, Cudgegong Cruisers, and Mudgee Junior Rugby League.

September is Mudgee's annual Wine and Food Month. The event is now one of New South Wales' longest running wine and food festivals and features a diverse range of events including tastings, trivia, dinners and more.
