THE AR BLUETT AWARD

2022 WINNER
A R Bluett Award



Council has won the state's top local government award – the 2022 AR Bluett Award. Council was named the winner in the Regional/Rural category at the Local Government NSW Annual Conference in October.

Awarded annually since 1945, the AR Bluett Award is the greatest accolade a council can receive and is recognised as the pinnacle of local government achievement. Council previously won the award in 2013.

Bluett Trustee Chairman, Les McMahon said Council completed a number of key projects over the past year that improved customer service and diversified the local economy.

"Mid-Western Regional Council's focus on driving improvements across all facets of its organisation has delivered enormous benefits for its community," Mr McMahon said.

"It completed a range of projects including the Mudgee Arts Precinct and Stage 2 of the Glen Willow Regional Sporting Complex, while also

undertaking a range of customer service improvements."

General Manager Brad Cam said Council demonstrated how it delivered beyond the standard rates, roads and rubbish accountabilities.

"Whilst we did complete and deliver on some major capital works projects, we also implemented smart technologies to monitor our water usage, reduce our electricity consumption with LED street lighting and in turn offset it with a Council-owned Solar Array," Mr Cam said.

"We've improved services for our community with an all new website, reduced our environmental footprint by diverting 11,200 tonnes of organic waste from landfill and worked with state and federal governments to immunise our community against COVID-19.

"I would like to acknowledge the work of Council's 472 employees who give their all and are passionate about providing for our community."

MUDGEES ARTS PRECINCT BUILDING DESIGN RECEIVES STATE ARCHITECTURE AWARD

Mudgee Arts Precinct's building design has been recognised by the Australian Institute of Architecture.

The design by BKA Architecture received the Institute's 2022 NSW Country Division Award for Public Architecture.

Jury Chair, Noel Thomson said: "The Mudgee Regional Arts Precinct blends the refurbishment of the former Cudgegong Shire building with a new gallery environment containing flexible exhibition spaces, tourism offices and

ancillary facilities.

"The design captures a contemporary expression of the arts and architecture respecting and enhancing an existing heritage environment."

Council staff worked collaboratively with BKA Architecture, Hutchison Builders and Create NSW to design a building that delivered on all the community's needs and was both eye-catching and sympathetic to the local heritage streetscape.

SUBMIT A BUDGET PROPOSAL FOR NEW COUNCIL PROJECTS

Council has commenced its budget planning for the next financial year and is encouraging residents to submit proposals as part of the process.

Residents can put forward a 'Community Plan Proposal' (CPP) for new infrastructure, projects, activities and improvements throughout the region to be considered in the 2023/24 Operational Plan.

The plan sets out the projects and activities which Council is committed to over the coming financial year, as well as measures and time frames to achieve this. The plan includes Council's Revenue Policy (Rating Model), 2023/24 proposed Fees and Charges, Capital Works Program, Annual Budget and Delivery Program.

Successful community proposals that have recently

been completed include hand dryers in Gulgong Memorial Hall, replacement of synthetic surface at the cricket nets at Victoria Park Gulgong (pictured), and renewal of footpath in Memorial Park Mudgee.

Proposals can be made on Council's website from now until 9 January.

COUNCIL OPERATIONS AND FACILITY UPDATES OVER CHRISTMAS PERIOD

Council Customer Service Centres, Works Depots and Libraries will close for the Christmas break from 12 noon on Thursday 22 December 2022, and reopen on Wednesday 4 January 2023.

Waste facilities in Mudgee, Gulgong and Kandos will be closed Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day.

Kerbside waste collection and essential services will not be affected over the Christmas and New Year break and will continue as normal.

Please ensure that your bins are placed out the night before your collection day.

Local swimming pools will be closed Christmas Day but will be open Boxing Day and New Year's Day.

SUPPORT THE REGION'S BUSINESSES **SHOP LOCAL**

It is more important than ever to shop locally this Christmas and support local businesses. Spending locally means money stays in the community, boosting the local economy and maintaining the employment of the 1,060 people who work in the region's retail industry. Local consumer data* revealed that residents spent \$46.3 million outside the region in the December 2021 quarter. If ten per cent of this amount (\$4.63 million) was instead spent locally, it would create 35 new jobs and provide a major boost to the region's economy.

NEVER DRIVE, SWIM, PLAY OR FISH IN FLOOD WATER

The region was hit by two successive flood events within two weeks of each other in October.

With further major downpours forecast for the summer, Council is reiterating the message of the NSW SES to never enter flood waters.


General Manager Brad Cam said flooding events may continue, and residents are urged to abide by road closures and follow advice from the SES.

"If you see a closure sign never disregard it. The road has been assessed and closed by Council because the road is either flooded or badly damaged. If you come across a flooded road, simply stop and turn back," Mr Cam said.

"We are aware that people have been playing, even boogie boarding and fishing in flooded areas and parks, which is extremely dangerous.

"As you'll hear from the SES, flood water can be faster flowing and deeper than it appears, and can also contain sewage, poisons, dead animals and debris.

"Flash floods erode road and path surfaces, leaving potholes, sinkholes and other dangers. Please do not encourage anyone, particularly children to play in flooded areas. Never drive, ride, or walk through flood water."
