# SCHOOL HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES



Young people across the region are in for a jam-packed schedule of fun and engaging activities these winter school holidays, with Council's Youth Services rolling out a diverse program designed especially for young people aged 12 to 24 years.

From creative workshops and gaming sessions to accredited training and day trips, there's something to suit every interest. Drop-in sessions in Kandos and Gulgong will give young people the chance to relax with friends, play console and board games, try their hand at journalling, or just enjoy music in a welcoming space.

In Mudgee, youth aged 16 to 24 can take part in a free, accredited CPR course at the Country Universities Centre — a valuable opportunity to learn essential life-saving skills and basic first aid (15 July).

Budding performers can look forward to a dynamic theatre workshop at Town Hall Cinema (17 July), led by local talent Sam Paine from Mudgee Performing Arts. The session will explore storytelling through performance and include fun theatre games designed to boost confidence and stage presence.

For those who love the outdoors and photography, the Cudgegong Camera Club will host a guided photo walk through the Putta Bucca Wetlands (18 July). Participants will be shown how to capture the perfect nature shot, with cameras available to borrow or the option to bring your own.

A special day trip to Dubbo will offer a mix of excitement and history, with young people invited to solve puzzles in an Escape Room before heading off on a guided tour of the Old Dubbo Gaol (16 July).

And for those unable to attend in person, Council is also offering a creative online competition and free mailout activity kits to keep everyone entertained during the break.

All activities are free but places are limited, so bookings are essential. For activity dates and to register, visit Council's website.

# DISCOUNTED PET DESEXING AND FREE MICROCHIPPING

A \$140 discount will be available per procedure, with an additional discount available for a limited number of pension concession card holders. This joint initiative aims to make the service more accessible to the community and encourage responsible pet care.

The discount is available during August only and is limited to one desexing procedure per household. Expressions of interest open on Council's website on 1 July and close 18 July. Customers can nominate their preferred vet with only 100 spots available. Veterinary practices will contact customers directly to arrange an appointment. Submitting an expression of interest does not guarantee a booking.


## **COMMITTEE ADDRESSING GP SHORTAGE DOCTORS 4 MUDGEE REGION**

Doctors 4 Mudgee Region Inc was established on 28 January 2025 as a grassroots initiative jointly supported by Council and local mining partners. Created to address the urgent need for healthcare access across Mudgee, Gulgong, Rylstone, and Kandos, the program aims to attract ten doctors to the region over the next three years.

The committee brings together voices from the community, local mines, Council, South Mudgee Surgery, Mudgee Medical Centre, and local hospitals. Major funding has been provided by Glencore, Yancoal and

Peabody, with additional significant support from Council. This funding underpins a package of financial incentives of up to \$45,000 per doctor, designed to encourage long-term retention, alongside tailored relocation and integration support into the region.

Encouraging progress has been made, with discussions already underway with several doctors. A cardiologist (Dr Rajan Rehan) and a sonographer are now also visiting the region monthly to provide cardiology services. To learn more visit doctors4mudgee.com.au.

## COUNCIL MOVES TO DIGITAL LEP MAPPING

The Mid-Western Regional Local Environmental Plan (LEP) is a legal document that guides planning controls such as minimum lot size and land use zoning. It affects every parcel of land in our region.

The LEP is a written document and a series of maps. Council is transitioning away from traditional PDF maps within the LEP to a fully digital LEP mapping system.

This change will make mapping easier to access for the community and will also improve transparency by allowing users to track changes to the LEP over time.

Once PDF maps are phased out, all LEP spatial data will be available digitally via the NSW Planning Portal planningportal.nsw.gov.au/ spatialviewerhistoric. For more information contact council@midwestern.nsw.gov.au.
