COMBATTING MISUSE OF WASTE TRANSFER STATIONS

Ulan Waste Transfer Station was locked to non-Ulan residents earlier this year following ongoing misuse and illegal dumping.

Council undertook consultation and engagement with nearby residents and property owners ahead of locking the facility in January. Since then, Council has seen a reduction in misuse of the site and the dumping of incorrect waste types.

Ulan residents can now access the facility via an electronic key and digitally via an app. Council congratulates the Ulan community on its effort in keeping the facility clean and tidy.

Native trees and shrubs will be planted near the new road bridge at Glen Willow to revegetate areas of the Cudgegong River.


This tree planting event will take place at Glen Willow on Saturday, 13 May from 8am to 11am.

REDUCING INVASIVE SPECIES AT CARP MUSTER

More than 115 carp were removed from Putta Bucca Wetlands recently as part of the annual Carp Muster. Hosted by Council and Local Land Services, the fishing competition is held each year to raise awareness of the invasive species and reduce its numbers in local waterways. Carp have destructive feeding habits and spread to new waterways, competing with native fish and reducing water guality.

Over 200 people attended this year's event at Putta Bucca Wetlands. Council would like to thank partners Club Mudgee Fishing Club and Mudgee Men's Shed for their assistance with the event.

ILLEGAL DUMPERS ISSUED CLEAN UP COSTS

Unfortunately, Council's Rural Waste Transfer Stations continue to be the target of illegal dumping.

Last month, asbestos and tyres were dumped at two facilities and reported by the public. Thanks to these reports and evidence collected from surveillance cameras, Council was able to issue a clean-up cost notice to the individuals who illegally dumped these waste items.

A clean-up cost notice was also issued for incorrect disposal of tyres. Tyres are a trackable waste similar to asbestos and are not accepted at any unmanned Waste Transfer Stations.
