The Composition of Youth Council

Ideally, the Youth Council shall comprise of at least two (2) representatives of each of the high schools (including St Matthews Central School) in Gulgong, Rylstone, Kandos and Mudgee together with up to four (4) delegates from the general community, including TAFE students.

Youth Council representatives are local youth aged 13 to 21 years.

Youth Council Officer Bearers (Youth Mayor and Deputy Youth Mayor) will be elected for a term of twelve months at first meeting of the calendar year.

Youth Council Meetings

One meeting per school term, in person at the Council Chambers, Market St Mudgee. The meeting is held on a weekday of the Youth Council's choosing, at 4.10pm (to allow travel from Gulgong, Kandos or Rylstone after school).
